Commissioned research: NoHo Partners – Lower guidance and lays off personnel in Finland due to strict restaurant restrictions

Marketing material commissioned by NoHo Partners

NoHo Partners lowers its 2021 guidance owing to strict restrictions on restaurant opening hours, local restrictions on gatherings and the Finnish government's decisions to abolish the use of COVID-19 passport. As a consequence, the company will have to close almost all of its restaurants in Finland and lay off nearly all of its personnel. For 2021E, the company expects around EUR 185m sales (previously: around EUR 190m) and above EUR 10m positive operating cash flow (previously: approximately EUR 12m positive). For Q4, NoHo expects more than EUR 8m positive operating cash flow (previously: more than EUR 10m positive) and below EUR 70m sales (previously: around EUR 70m). Refinitiv consensus has been expecting EUR 187m sales in 2021E. Finnish government announced new restrictions after negotiations on 21 December. New restrictions are coming into force from 24 December and will tighten on 28 December. Restrictions should last for three weeks from 28 December. Traditionally, the beginning of the year is the weak season for the restaurants, hence the impact from the restrictions could be limited for 2022E. However, we note the risk for prolonged situation. Given the new guidance, NoHo implicitly expects its operating cash flow to remain positive in December, while swing in net working capital should cause some short-term liquidity pressure, we note. NoHo had EUR 10.9m cash and cash equivalents at the end of Q3 while it made additional repayment of loans amounting to EUR 8.7m after Q3. In addition, the company has 5.9m shares in Eezy, worth around EUR 34m.

Restaurant restrictions are tightening again in Finland

Finnish government announced on 21 December that restrictions for restaurants are tightening from 24 December with further tightening from 28 December. New restrictions should be in force for three weeks from 28 December. Food restaurants can remain open until 8 p.m. with COVID-19 passport, while serving of alcohol has to end at 5 p.m. Hence, we believe the majority of food restaurants that normally serve late, will be closed. We note likely government supports, while the level and timing of these is highly uncertain. NoHo has received EUR 3.8m government grants in Finland in 2021 (received during H1) and EUR 4.2m in 2020.

We believe the company could operate with break-even operating cash flow when monthly sales reach roughly EUR 14-15m. However, this would require opening hours until 23 p.m. with alcohol serving until 22 p.m., we think.

NoHo layoffs its personnel and commences new co-operation negotiations

As a consequence of the new restrictions, NoHo will close almost all of its restaurants in Finland and lay off nearly all of its personnel. We believe the company will operate some of its fast food restaurants during the restriction period. In addition, the company will commence new co-

operations negotiations in order to minimise the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and to prepare for a possible extension of the pandemic situation. The negotiations concern all Noho's employees in Finland, totalling 1,250 employees. New co-operation negotiations should allow NoHo to act quickly if restrictions are prolonged in Finland.

Cash flows should face short-term headwinds – equity ratio is low

Although the company expects more than EUR 8m positive operating cash flow in Q4 (more than EUR 6m in October-November), the swing in net working capital could cause short-term pressure on liquidity. If the situation is prolonged, we believe there is maximum of EUR 10m negative effect from working capital. NoHo had EUR 10.9m cash and cash equivalents at the end of Q3 while it made additional repayment of loans amounting to EUR 8.7m after Q3. In addition, the company has ~5.9m shares in Eezy, worth around EUR 34m on 21 December. Eezy stake is valued around EUR 30m in NoHo's balance sheet. When adjusting for EUR 8.7m repayment, we calculate roughly EUR 33m of current financial liabilities at the end of Q3 of which majority due in Q2 2022.

In addition, the company currently has a low equity ratio of 14.6% (at the end of Q3). Prior to the latest restrictions, we had expected roughly 16% equity ratio in 2021E and 18% in 2022E.
